Sir Thomas de Brewose or Breouse of Manningford, Tetbury ...He married Margaret. He d. 2 Sep 1395 and was buried at Horsham, Sussex. His widow m 2ndly ...Sir William Burcestre. She m. 3rdly ...Sir John Berkeley of Beverstone, co. Gloucester.

Margaret (c. 1374-1444), was a daughter of Ralph de Cheyney, Kt (1337-1400) by his wife Joan Paveley.

She married

- 1. Abt 1386, Edmund Hogshaw (1372-1388), son and heir of Thomas Hogshaw, Kt by his wife Emmeline, daughter of Edmund Cleveden, Kt. No issue.
- 2. Abt 1389, Thomas Brewes (1362-1395) of Tetbury, Horsham, Sussex. By him she had a son Thomas born and died an infant in 1395, and a daughter Joan b. abt 1392, died 1395.
- 3. January 1396, William Burcestre, Kt. (d.1407). By him she had their heir, a son John (c.1404-1466 s.p.) and a daughter Willelma who was wife of Walter Urrey of Rusper Sussex. The latter had a daughter Alice who married Thomas Hoo of Horsham and died without issue in 1486.
- 4. Bef 1409, William Breton, esq. Fl 1409/1411, d. by 1419. No issue
- 5. Bef 1427, John Berkeley, Kt of Beverstone (1352-1428). No issue

Margaret died in London and was buried in Christ Church Priory, Aldgate, London. Stow describes her tomb, "Dame Margaret daughter to Sir Ralph Chenie, wife to Sir John Barkeley, to Sir Thomas Barues, and to Sir W. Bursire". Her son, John de Burcestre, Kt, was the executor to her will, which does not seem to have survived.
