THE KING'S LEVEE. (From the Court Newsman.)

Yesterday the King held his first Levee this season, at his Palace, St. James's.

A guard of honour of the Foot Guards, with their band in state dresses, occupied the palace-yard, and a detachment of the Royal Horse Guards were stationed in the large courtyard, where the general company enter.

The doors of the Palace were opened above half an hour before the appointed time, in order to prevent confusion in the setting down of the company, many of whom had by that time arrived.

A little before 2 o'clock the Corporation of the city of Dublin arrived, in grand procession. The Lord Mayor, in his full robes, carrying his white wand of office, attended by the bearers of the mace, the sword of state, and the cap of maintenance, came in the state carriage. His Lordship was accompanied by Mr. J. Shaw, the Recorder, the Rev. George Blacker, the Chaplain to the Corporation, Sheriffs Mallet and Halahan; Aldermen, Sir Abraham Bradley King, Sir Edmond Nugent, Sir Thomas Whelan, Alderman Morrison, and Alderman Smith, together with a number of the members of the Court of Common Council.

The King entered the State Rooms precisely at 2 o'clock, and gave audiences to the Colonel of the Guards, and to the Field Officer in waiting, who made his report of the effective state of the three regiments of Foot Guards.

His Majesty, dressed in an Admiral's uniform, took his seat on the throne, for the purpose of receiving an Address of congratulation on his accession, and of condolence on the demise of the late King, from the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland. Near the throne stood the Dukes of Cumberland and Cambridge, Prince Leopold, the Cabinet Ministers, the Lord Steward, the Master of the Horse, Earl Belfast, Vice Chamberlain, the Treasurer of the Household, the Groom of the Stole, the

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Lord in waiting, the Captain of the Yeoman Guard, and the Page of Honour in waiting.
