And another writ to John Adams deputy sheriff of the county aforesaid, which the same deputy showed here in court, the tenor follows in these words:

Henry by the grace of God king of England and France and lord of Ireland, to the sheriff of Wiltshire. Whereas we lately commanded thee to cause to be exacted Richard Molens late of Sandehill in the parish of Fordyngrigg in county Southampton gentelman from county (court) to county, until according to the law and custom of our realm of England he should be outlawed if he not appear, and if he appear then thou shouldst take him and cause him to be kept safe, so that you might have his body before our justices at Westminster a month from Easter to answer to Thomas Blakker, in a plea that he render him 40s that he owes him and unjustly withholds, so it is said: however, because, before the emanation of our writ aforesaid of exigend, the aforesaid Richard, by Thomas Molens his attorney, had been ready in our same court and many times appeared to answer the aforesaid Thomas Blakker in the plea aforesaid, as is plain to our justices at Westminster upon due examination made in this behalf, and so our writ of exigend against the aforesaid Richard issued too hastily from our court aforesaid: we command you that thou shalt supersede completely from further exacting, outlawing or in any way molesting the aforesaid Richard by reason of our said writ of exigend. And if you have taken and imprisoned the said Richard for that reason, then you shall without delay deliver the said Richard from the prison in which he is so detained if he is detained in the same for that reason and for no other, as is just. And thou shalt report how thou hast executed this our command to our justices at Westminster at the term aforesaid. And thou shalt have there this writ. Witness Thomas Bryan at Westminster, the 6th day of February in the 4th year of our reign
