*Andrew late baron of Castlestewart deceased, in his lifetime was seised, as of fee, of the townlands and lands of Kilsally and Ballymagwier, with appurtenances, lying in county Tyrone, containing, by estimation, 200 acres of land or more or less, and worth per annum in all issues beyond reprises 40s sterling. — Being so seised thereof in such estate, afterwards, by his deed lawfully made, bearing date 1 May 1628 or thereabouts, for and in consideration of the sum of £200 sterling of good and lawful money of England, paid him in cash by Gilbert Kennedy gentleman, he sold to the sane Gilbert Kennedy and to John Collis the said townlands and lands of Kilsally and Ballymagwier, with appurtenances; to hold to the said Gilbert for his natural life, and afterwards to the said John Collis and his heirs and assigns, for ever; rendering thence to the said Andrew baron of Castlestewart, his heirs and assigns, an annual rent of 40s sterling at the feasts of All Saints and of SS Philip and James (commonly called May Day) by equal portions.— The aforesaid Gilbert Kennedy, by virtue of the said deed of sale, was seised, as of fee farm, of the townlands and lands aforesaid, with appurtenances. — The aforesaid Gilbert and John afterwards, but their deed lawfully made and bearing date 1 May 1638, or thereabouts, for and in consideration of £200 sterling, of good and lawful*

*money of England, paid them in cash by Henry Boyne senior, sold to the same Henry Boyne and his heirs and assigns, for ever, the aforesaid townlands and lands of Kilsally and Ballymagwier, with appurtenances, at the yearly rent and under the conditions mentioned above. — The aforesaid Henry Boyne senior was seised and possessed, in his lifetime, of the said townlands and lands of Kilsally and Ballymagwier, with appurtenances, and died so thereof seised. — Henry Boyne junior was his son and heir. — The aforesaid Henry was seised, in his demesne and of fee farm, of the townlands and lands aforesaid, with appurtenances; and, being so thereof seised, afterwards, by his deed bearing date 10 July 1655, for and in consideration of the sum of £200 sterling, paid him in cash by Valentine Blacker of Carrick in county Armagh esquire, sold to the same Valentine Blacker and to his heirs, for ever, the aforesaid townlands and lands, with appurtenances, at the annual rent and under the conditions mentioned above, as by the said deed, the tenor of which follows in the original, appears. — George Blacker, by virtue of the said deed of sale, is now in peaceful possession of the said townlands and lands, with appurtenances, and receives the rents and profits of the same. — The said townlands and lands were held and now are held by the said Andrew late baron of Castlestewart deceased, and by his heirs and assigns, from the king, and his predecessors and successors, as of the castle of Dublin, in free and common socage, and not in chief, nor by socage in chief, nor by knight service.*
