PETITION to the QUEEN of ARTHUR BROWNLOW, Esq., in behalf of himself and [the] inhabitants of Lurgan Clanbrazill, within the manor of Brownlow's derry, co. Armagh.

*Shews:—*

“The said town of Lurgan is a large village consisting of a great many store houses well shingled and finished and abounding with a great number of British inhabitants, who are industrious and trading people, and have considerably advanced and improved several manufactories, and especially the linen manufacture there, and is, as they conceive, one of the most thriving, flourishing villages and most considerable market towns of . . . Ulster.” There are only two towns — Armagh and Charlemont — in Armagh which send members or burgesses to Parliament, “though the said county of Armagh for the most part is a British plantation.”

The town of Lurgan and adjacent lands lie in the manor of Brownlow's derry, which was made a manor by patents granted by King James I to the ancestors of the petitioner Brownlow; whereby the seneschal has power to hold plea for any sum of under 40s.

Petitioners think it would be to the advantage of the town and parts adjacent if the Queen would grant to the inhabitants by patents that they and their successors should return two burgesses to Parliament in Ireland, “in order to move and represent such matters as shall be thought

convenient for the encouragement of trade”; and that the manor should be a Court of Record and the seneschal have jurisdiction up to 10*l*.

## **Edward Blacker, lunatic.**

Inquisition taken at the City of New Sarum, 23rd March, 22 Charles I [1647], before *Thomas Hancocke, gent., Giles Sadler, gent., and Andrew Pewd, gent.*, commissioners appointed to inquire as to the lunacy of *Edward Blacker* by the oath, etc. [jurors not given], who say that

*Edward Blacker* is a lunatic and enjoys lucid intervals, but is incapable of governing either himself or his lands. He was a lunatic on the 14th March, 1645, and not at any other time that the jurors know of, but how long before the said 14th March he became demented is not known.

*Edward Blacker* was seised of the manor and capital messuage of Weste Harneham and of divers lands, meadows, and pastures thereto belonging; the reversion of 3 messuages and one cottage there, parcel of the said manor, in the several tenures of *John Young, esq., John Jefferie, William Jefferie, and Richard Woodward*; and of the manor and capital messuage of Person, within the parish of Gillingham, co. Dorset, and of divers messuages, lands, and tenements thereto belonging.

Of whom all the said premises are held the jurors know not: they are worth per annum, clear, £160.

*Alice*, wife of *William Willoughby*<sup>3</sup>, esq., *Mary Willoughbie*<sup>4</sup>, widow, and *Katherine*, wife of *Thomas Chomley*, are his kinswomen and next heirs, to wit, sisters of *William Blacker, esq.*, deceased, father of the said *Edward Blacker*: they are all aged 21 years and more.

## *GENERAL ELECTION.*

### ARMAGH, JUNE 22.

The election for the county Armagh, commenced to-day, at one o'clock, but the business was confined to merely putting the several candidates in nomination. Mr. Caulfield, one of the late Members, was proposed by Sir Capel Molyneux, Bart. and seconded by Mr. Bond. Mr. Brownlow was put in nomination by Mr. L. Dobbin, and seconded by Mr. W. M'Williams. Colonel Blacker, in a speech of considerable ability, in which he commented with force, upon the defection from the Protestant cause of Mr. Brownlow, proposed Colonel Verner. This proposition was seconded by Mr. Atkinson, after which the several candidates proceeded to address the electors, Mr. Caulfield taking precedence. The only thing for which this gentleman's speech was remarkable was, that he denied, distinctly, having formed a coalition with Mr. Brownlow, whose success, however, he most sincerely wished. Mr. Brownlow next presented himself, and was received with the most unequivocal marks of disapprobation. (Cries of "Judas Brownlow, turn-coat, Papist," were heard at intervals, amidst the din of hisses and uproar, which his appearance called forth.) In vain did he attempt to obtain a hearing. He implored, in the name of justice, for the sake of honour, that he might be allowed to explain his conduct, and, after remaining on his legs for nearly an hour, he was compelled to sit down. Col. Verner next addressed the electors, and pledged himself to support the Constitution in Church and State, as established by law. The Court was then adjourned to nine o'clock to-morrow, when the polling will commence. The horses were taken from Col. Verner's carriage, and himself and two ladies of his family were drawn to the temporary residence in the town. Mr. Brownlow was assailed by hisses, cries of "Judas," &c. as he passed, and Mr. Caulfield was allowed to proceed home almost unnoticed.

or were commanded to Garrisons and not provided for ought to have full pay for the period 19 Dec. 1715 to 19 April 1716: whereupon the Muster Master General of Ireland has prepared a list of such Officers accordingly, whereby it appears that the whole amounts to 3743*l.* 11*s.* 6*d.*, but that certain Officers whose pay amounts to 323*l.* 13*s.* 6*d.* have not returned proper certificates to the Muster Master of their attendance, which sum ought therefore to be deducted, but it is represented that since the making up the list such Officers may have such certificates to produce, wherefore they are to be empowered to be paid when so certified. *Out Letters (Ireland) X*, pp. 180-1.
