136.¹ Monday after Martinmas 46 Edward III, 1371.² Grant by John Dey of³ Staynton and Alice his wife to Richard de Blacker and his heirs, of all their lands and tenements within the bounds of Blacker and a third part *del Calfrod*, with meadows, woods and other apurtenances; to hold of the chief lord of the fee, and rendering to the grantors for the ensuing fourteen⁴ years 9s. 10d. at Whitsuntide and Martinmas in equal portions, with power to distrain if the rent should be in arrear for more than fifteen days. And if Richard or his heirs should hold the premises beyond nineteen years he should render 20s. yearly at the same terms in equal portions, with power to the grantors to distrain. Witnesses, Adam de Moselay, John de Bretton, John Kyng, John del Wyk, Robert de Chauntclere, John Grenehod. Crigeleston^{5,6} And if the said tenements were to be sold Richard should have the first opportunity.⁷ (*Lord Allendale*, Crigglestone, No. 3).⁸

137.⁹ Sept. 20, 8 Henry VIII [1516]. Grant by Thomas Blakkerr of Blakkerhall to William Froste, Walter Bradford, Ralph Amyas, vicar of the church of Penyston, and John Frankysh, vicar of the church of Warmefeld, of his capital messuage called Blakkerhall, with all closes, meadows, lands and tenements, with appurtenances, and all other messuages, lands, tenements, burgages, meadows, woods and pastures, with appurtenances in Crygleston¹⁰, Chappelthorpe, Heton, and Wakefeld, and elsewhere in co. York; to fulfil the grantor's intention expressed in a schedule annexed. (*sd.*) per me Thomas Blacker.¹¹

*Schedule*¹²: to hold to the use of Thomas for his life; after his death the feoffees to grant to Agnes his wife a yearly rent of 4*li.*, payable at Whitsuntide and Martinmas in equal portions, in the name of all dower which she should claim or have by right, or else at their discretion to make her an estate for life of lands and tenements of the same value in lieu; and to allow her to occupy two parlours [and] one chamber called the Newwarks, built at the west end of the hall called Blakkerhall, with "one colehouse & a swynehouse to the helpyng of the seid Agnes & of hire children as long as the seid Agnes keppeth hire sole & unmaryed," and should she take a husband they were to be seised of these premises with the residue of all his other messuages [and] lands aforesaid to the use of Ralph his son and heir apparent, and his heirs.
