**123.**<sup>11</sup> Friday after St. John of Beverley, 17 Richard II (May 8, 1394). Grant by John Dey of Staynton and Alice his wife to John son of Richard de Blakkarre, his heirs and assigns, of a moiety of a tenement called Blakkarre, with all lands, meadows, and appurtenances in Crigulston<sup>12</sup> and its territories; rendering yearly 13s. 4d. at Whitsuntide and Martinmas in equal portions. Witnesses, John de Riley, Thomas Andrew of Chapelthorp, John Andrew of the same, Hugh Wayde, Thomas de Sylkeston. Blakkarre<sup>13</sup>. (*Lord Allendale, Crigglestone, No. 1*).
