*Memorandum that the Justices here on the 9th day of February this same term delivered here in court to John Whetham, deputy sheriff of the county aforesaid, a writ close of the lord king addressed to the same sheriff in form of carrying out the law, the tenor of which said writ follows in these words: Edward by the grace of God king of England and France and lord of Ireland, to the sheriff of the town of Southampton, greeting: we order you that you shall distrain John Shropshire, Thomas Avan, Vincent Tehy, Thomas Smyth, John Sprynge, William Spersholt, David Whit, Geoffrey Mombray, Gabriel Honley, Massa Salman, Thomas Krekyrwode and Richard Hilton, jurors summoned in our court before our justices at Westminster between Thomas Blakker of the city of New Sarum tanner, plaintiff, and John Walker of Southampton marchant and Christopher Ambrose of Southampton marchant in a plea of trespass, through all their lands and chattels in your bailiwick; so that neither they nor anyone on their behalf shall put their hands on them, until you shall have further order from us therein; and that you shall answer to us for the issues of the same; and that you shall have their bodies before our justices at Westminster at three weeks from Easter to make that jury, and to hear their judgment for many defaults. We also order you to put in that jury ten such, both knights and other free and lawful men, for that view, and that you shall have them before the aforesaid our justices at Westminster at the term aforesaid to make the jury aforesaid; so that that jury at that date shall not fail to be taken for lack of jurors; and that you shall bring there the names of those appointed anew, together with this writ.
