PLEURO-PNEUMONIA.

Professor Sewell, at the request of the council, reported on a communication received from Mr. Murray Blacker, in Suffolk, on the subject of the prevalence of pleuro-pneumonia amongst cattle. Professor Sewell and Mr. Simonds (lecturer on cattle pathology at the Royal Veterinary College) had fully considered that communication, and were of opinion, that the cases alluded to by Mr. Blacker as originating from the introduction among his stock of two newly-purchased cows, one of which became affected in one month, and the other in two months after their purchase, were not the result of infection; for had infection taken place the attack would, in their opinion, have taken place in a few days. Professor Sewell referred in the opinion he had stated on former occasions, that this disorder generally yields to early depletion, when recourse is had to that measure in due time.
