DEATH OF A FENIAN CONVICT AT PORTLAND PRISON. — An inquest was held at the Convict Prison, on Thursday week<sup>6</sup>, on the body of Wm. Pherson Thompson, aged 30, a Fenian convict under sentence of penal servitude for life, for being implicated in the murder of Sergeant Brett, at Manchester, two or three years ago. From the evidence of the governor of the prison, George Clifton, Esq., it appears the deceased was admitted into the prison on the 15th of April, 1869, and into the infirmary on the 26th of March last, where he remained until the time of his death, which took place on the 28th inst., he having been 94 days in the infirmary. He is said to have been of very good character since his admission into the prison. Alfred John Scriven, the principal warder in charge of the infirmary, having detailed the diet and treatment which the deceased had had in the hospital, William Roupell, the ex-M.P. for Lambeth, was sworn. He said — I am a convict in the Portland Convict Establishment, and, as one of the nurse orderlies in the infirmary, have waited on the deceased since his admission, and was at his side at the time of his death. During the period he was in the infirmary he had every attention paid him, and every reasonable indulgence. He had oranges, jellies, eggs, wine, brandy, and other kinds of nourishment. He asked to be allowed to have lean chops, boiled chicken, boiled mutton, and sherry wine, and his requests were granted. He expressed himself more than once how satisfied he was with the kindness shown him, and in my presence thanked both the medical officers and the governor for their attention to him, as well as for several acts of kindness. At his request I frequently read to him from his Roman Catholic Bible, and he appeared to give himself up entirely for the future. Edgar Shaw Blaker, the medical officer of the prison, said that the cause of death was consumption, and the jury returned a verdict accordingly.

## *RAILWAY INTELLIGENCE.*

### LEWES AND UCKFIELD.

The half-yearly general meeting of the shareholders in this company was held on Tuesday<sup>7</sup> at their offices, High-street, Lewes, Mr. R. W. Blencowe, chairman of the board of directors, presiding.

The report, of which the following is an abstract, was read:— “The directors congratulate the proprietors on the completion and opening of their line on the 18th October last, on which day it was accepted as complete by the London, Brighton, and South Coast Company, and opened to the public, and it is gratifying to know that the traffic already developed is highly satisfactory. The directors have been enabled to procure upon loan all the money they have required, at 4½ per cent. The expenditure for land, works, and engineering is brought to a close, and the only remaining heads of cost relate to the completing of the land purchases, and the directors are informed that the estimate of these claims is still considered sufficient. They therefore retain the belief that the line will be finished at the estimated expense of £47,000. It is possible that a small expense, not included in this estimate, may be incurred in closing the affairs of the company, as it will be necessary to retain its machinery in existence until towards the close of the year. The London, Brighton, and South Coast Company have introduced into Parliament a bill to enable them to purchase the undertaking of this company upon the terms agreed upon, and they have intimated their readiness to complete the purchase immediately after the passing of the act. The directors congratulate the proprietors upon this prospect of the speedy repayment of their capital. The company are entitled to receive the stipulated rent from the London, Brighton, and South Coast Company, from the 18th October last,

amounting, to December 31st, to the sum of £386 6s.; and after paying the interest upon loans and advances beyond the calls the balance will be carried to the current half-year's account, and be included in the dividend which will be due to the proprietors up to the 30th of June next."

The CHAIRMAN moved, and Colonel HARCOURT seconded the motion for the adoption of the report, which was carried unanimously.

The retiring directors — Mr. R. W. Blencowe, Mr. A. Donovan, and Captain Dalbial — were then re-elected, as was the retiring auditor, Mr. J. Blaker.
