New Shoreham

In 1330, John Kingswode of Findon gave the [Carmelite] Friars [of Shoreham] a tenement in the town of New Shoreham, which he held under the Temple. This tenement was described as having the house of Simon Crabwych on the south side of it and that of Robert Herryngs, together with other houses the property of John le Blaker, John de la Knaue, John le Ferur and Simon Trenchmere on the west, and the marsh of the Templars, called "le Templestead," to the north and east. Among the witnesses to this deed was a John de Bokyngham. Kingswoode also gave them at Christmas in the same year, by the hands of their Prior, Nicholas de Bedinges, six marks sterling of good and lawful money, in addition to twelve marks due to him on the purchase of the house alluded to.

William Arnold, aged 60, deposes similarly, and states that Richard Drewe dwelled “with the Lord Dacre of the South,” being in his service, and that the said Lord desired the said Thomas, father to the said Richard, to give the same Richard some of the said lands² to live by, whereupon the said Thomas desired respite to make the said Lord answer, and went to one Mr. Thomas Lewkenor of Brambiltie to have his advice, and Mr. Lewkenor said he could not make him any of the Tabilherst³ land but he must needs sue a recovery which would be both chargeable in law and conscience, and that, the said Thomas said he would never do. Deponent therefore believes that Mr. Lewkenor “knew well that Tabilherst⁴ land stood intayled.” He further deposes that he has heard one Blaker of Preston, now deceased, say that he held a deed of intail in his custody of Tabilherst lands, which deed he delivered to Sir Edward Bray, Knight, supposing it concerned lands which he, Blaker, sold to Sir Edward⁵.

In "Sussex Archæological Collections," Vol. XIX., p. 200, is set forth nearly *in extenso* the will which had previously been alluded to in Vol. III., p. 14, of Christian Blaker, of Portslade, widow, dated 21 Feb., 1578/9. As complementary thereto the following abstract of the will of her husband, Edward Blaker of "Porteslaide," which was dated 1 Oct., 1571, and was proved by his widow in the Consistory Court of Chichester, 17 Nov., 1571, may be acceptable:-

"To the Mother Church [of Chichester] 6^d and to the Poore of Porteslaide 3^s. 4^d. To everie of my godchyl dren cominge to my burriall 1^s. To the repayringe of the Highe Waye leadeinge from Poonings [Poynings] Gate towards Hill Foote 3^s. 4^d. To my sonne in lawe Ric: Cooke £10 and untoe Edwarde Cooke his sonne 20^s. To my sonne in lawe John Berd [Beard] £10 and untoe Edwarde his sonne 20^s. To my sonne in lawe Thomas Ffoggins £10. To my daughtere Barbara Blaker £30. I gif untoe Edwarde Blaker my sonne y^e occupacion of y^e house and lande whiche I latelye purchased in Southweek and I further gyve him after the dethe of my Wief the house I nowe lyve in but if my sonne dye withoute issue then" the testator gave the same successively "to my cosen John Blaker" then "to Richard sonne of my cosen John Blaker decesed" then "to my cosen Richarde sonne of myn uncle Richarde Blaker decesed." And he appointed Christian, his wife, his executrix.

The statement in Vol. XIX., p. 201, that Edward Blaker, the son of Christian, married with Susan, daughter of Tuppyn Scrase, is incorrect. Her son, Edward Blaker, of Portslade (with whom the Blaker pedigree in "Berry's Sussex Genealogies," p. 86, commences), married with Agnes, daughter of Robert Fowler, and died in 1594, his will, dated 16 July, 1584, having been proved at Lewes, 3 Dec., 1594, and it was their eldest son, Edward Blaker, of Portslade, and also of Buckingham, in Old Shoreham, who married with Susanna (not Susan) Scrase, who was only born in 1604, and was his second wife. This last-named Edward Blaker died in 1654, his will, dated 5 Oct., 1653, being proved 2 June, 1654 (P.C.C. 97, Alchin), and his widow, Susanna, who, in the memorial to her now on the interior of the west wall of Old Shoreham Church, is stated to have died 20 June, 1678, was, according to the Registers, buried there 9 May, 1679.

1. 19 Sept., 1666, being with two other ships he chased a French man-of-war. She outsailed the other two, but the *Swallow* came up with her and gave her several broadsides and killed and wounded many of her men and much disabled her and would have undoubtedly taken her, had the captain taken the lieutenant's advice on boarding her.

2. The suppliant reported his captain's miscarriage, which has bred such ill blood in him that he threatens to be revenged on him if he goes any more to sea with him.

3. The boatswain being dead since the ship came up to Woolwich, the captain to defraud his Majesty of two coils of rope and two pieces of new canvas had the rope sealed with his and the purser's seals and put in the carpenter's storeroom, but before they could convey it away the surveyors of Deptford seized it and carried it to Woolwich Yard 30 Oct., 1666.

4. The captain and purser have since defrauded his Majesty of ropes and two bolts of new canvas.

5. The captain has set several men ashore without their tickets and made tickets for men that were never on board and set them down dead and moneys have been received for their being killed.

6. Since her arrival at Woolwich 4 hogsheads of white wine that properly belonged to the seamen have been conveyed out of her.

7. The captain threatens to bring the seamen on their knees, when he gets them at sea, whereon several are run away and the rest are resolved not to go in the ship so long as he is commander.

8. In St. Helen's Road white wine was allowed for beer. The captain lowered several hogsheads into his storeroom and gave way for his cousin to sell it to the seamen, though it was their own, or else no wine.

9. They are willing to serve in the same ship or any other, though not with the same commander. [*S.P. Supplementary* 136, *No.* 433.]

Buckingham, Old Shoreham

Edward Blaker, who was living in 1645 and died October, 1653, is described in the memorial to his widow, Susannah, in Old Shoreham Church, as of Buckingham.

He was succeeded by his son Edward, who possessed the manor and estate and was Sheriff of Sussex in 1657 and M.P. for New Shoreham from 1658 to 1678.

By a deed, dated 11th July, 1657, Edward Blaker, therein described as of Old Shoreham, gent, in consideration of the love which he bore to Dorothy, his wife, and for further jointure in case she should outlive him, granted to her "the manor house called Buckingham House," which he had newly erected, with the dovehouses, barns, stables, gaterooms, courts and appurtenances and the closes called Northfield, Newfield, Eastfield, Tenne Acres and Southfield, all which were parcel of the farm called Buckingham Farm, and all other lands in Old Shoreham in his tenure. Edward Blaker, of course, rebuilt on the site of an older house which went by the name of Buckingham.

The memorial to this gentleman in Old Shoreham Church informs us that "his piety, loyalty, charity, humility and sweetness of disposition engaged the love and admiration of all that knew him in his life and noe less their lamentation at his death," and that "he exchanged this life for a better, 13th September, 1678, in ye 49 year of his age, whose sorrowful relict, Dorothy, ye daughter of Henry Goreing of Heydown in this county of Sussex, Esq., as a testimony of her never dyeing affection, hath paid her last tribute in this monument."

Dorothy Blaker's "never dyeing affection" for her first husband did not prevent her from entering a second time into the bonds of matrimony. She remarried, 9th April, 1681, at Kingston-Bowsey, Robert Hall, of Old Shoreham, son of Robert Hall of Rye, and found a last resting-place February 4th, 1683-4, in the north cloister of Westminster Abbey. Her second husband was also buried there 8th November, 1690.

After Edward Blaker's decease, the property devolved (subject to his widow's interests) on his brother William Blaker, who was Sheriff of Sussex in 1684 and died 6th October, 1703. He was buried at Old Shoreham. By his first wife, Ann, he had an only daughter, Susannah, the wife of John Monk, of Kingston-Bowsey (Member for New Shoreham in the Parliament summoned to meet at Westminster, 22nd January, 1688-9, and dissolved 6th February following). He died in 1701 and his wife in 1690 and both were buried at Kingston.

Another manor within the parish bears the name of *Ruspar*, alias Old Shoreham, and became separate from the chief manor before the middle of the 14th century. We then find it settled by a fine³¹ on Sir Richard de Abbesbury and his heirs, Sir John de Arundel being the owner,³² and the Fitzalans continued to hold it until the reign of Henry VIII., when, together with the estate of Buckingham,³³ it belonged to Thomas Bowyer. He sold it in 1553 to Stephen Boorde for £120, and from him it passed, *circa* 1608, to John Gage,³⁴ who was subsequently created a Baronet. Its next possessor seems to have been one Edward Blaker³⁵, who was succeeded by his son, William, and it then (1708) became the property of Will. Monke, esq.³⁶ (only son of John Monke and Hannah, dau. of Stephen Stringer), from whose two daughters, Jane May and Barbara Monke, it was purchased by Edward Elliston, of South Weald, co. Essex.³⁷

The following is a more accurate account of the Cockerham branch of this family.

...

RICHARD PRESTON, esq. of Hilhom House and Ellel, in Cockerham, who was born 17th September, 1661. This gentleman, by his extravagant mode of living, and an unfortunate propensity for play, had early in life incurred considerable debts. Fortunately, however, he had married in his father's lifetime Dorothy, daughter of Robert Dennis, esq. of Gloucestershire, upon which event all the property which was not under mortgage was put into settlement. By her he had issue one surviving child,

I. John, born in October, 1690.

Shortly after succeeding his father, Mr. Preston's debts and the old charges upon the property pressed so heavily upon him, that he was obliged to dispose of every thing that was not included in the settlement; and from this time he lived at Cockerham in great retirement until the year 1695, when succeeding in right of his wife to a considerable fortune, he again resumed his former habits, and within two years he had dissipated every shilling. His wife did not long survive, dying when her son was seven years of age. Mr. Preston then sold his life interest in his Lancashire estate and went to reside in Ireland, where he married Mary, relict of Mr. Dennis, and daughter and co-heir of Mr. Henry Hastings, of Dublin, by whom he had issue, (with two sons who died young),

Mr: Chabiere spoke to the Indians told them it was a shame for them to behave as they did, in carrying away and killing the King's Cattle on the Carrying place, and begged of them never to be guilty of the like folly again, told them to adhear to the English intrist and not to believe anything about the French's comeing again to this Country if they Could come it would be to digg a great Hole and put them all into it. desired them to be on their good behavior as all the mischief they would now do would be laid to his Charge, He then told them by the desire of Captain Brown that there was a Com^{ty}: appointed by Sir William Johnson to take care of them, and if they had any reason of Complaint in any way whatever against the English, they should address themselves to him as he is the Man that has the Care of You, and he will if posible redress all your grievances. Late in the year 1792 the Steine was the scene of unwonted excitement, the occasion being the first assembling of the members of a Society, established at Brighthelmston, "for the Protection of Liberty and Property against REPUBLICANS and Levellers." The Society had its rise in the patriotic feeling of the time, which revolted against the horrible excesses that, in the name of Liberty, were then being perpetrated in France. It was, in fact, the beginning of the Volunteer movement, which afterwards was so spontaneously developed, not only in Brighton and the County, but in all parts of the kingdom. The movement was warmly taken up in Brighton, and cordially supported by the neighbouring gentry; and among those who, at a meeting at "The Castle Tavern," formed themselves into a Committee to "carry into effect the ends and purposes of this Society," were Sir John Bridger, Knt., the Rev. Thos. Hudson, the Rt. Hon. Sir R. Heron, Bart., W. Wade, Esq., the Rev. John Mossop, Mr. Wm. Attree, Samuel Shergold, Esq., H. Courthope Champion, Esq., W. S.
