In Hanover, Holland, Brunwick, &c. domiciliary visits had been ordered in search of British property. They had not taken place at Hamburgh at the date of our accounts.

Messrs. Smith, Blaker, Burrows, and other members of the British Factory at Hamburgh, were on the 8th ordered to proceed to Verdun, but their departure was suspended till the 14th. They had not, however, been ordered off on the 16th.
