[LOUISE PHILIPPE AND PARTY AT NEWHAVEN]

On Saturday morning¹, before eight o'clock, several ladies and gentlemen had arrived, anxious to pay their respects to the Royal party. Amongst these were Mr. Lawrence and Lady Jane Peel, and the Rev. T. Cooke, with Miss Augusta Otway, who came from Brighton; and the Rev. Mr. Brookman and his lady, of Rottingdean. Count Duchâtel, Minister of the Interior, who also arrived from the Bedford Hotel, Brighton, had an audience of his Royal master. Large parties likewise arrived from Brighton and Lewes; and an address from the latter place was presented by a deputation, headed by Edward Blaker, Esq. Towards ten o'clock, a number of ladies had assembled in the large room of the inn, whither the King proceeded to pay his respects. The Royal party then prepared to take their departure, but their progress down stairs was intercepted at every step by fresh comers.
