I. THOMAS SAVILE, of Hullinedge, Elland, second son of Henry Savile, of Copley, Esq. (see *Genealogist*, N.S., xiii, 115). Admon. 11 Apr. 1457 to Isabella, rel., and Thomas and Henry, sons (Halifax Wills, p. 12); mar. first Ann, dau. of John Stansfeld, of Stansfeld. They had issue—
