Feoffment by Richard Burdet of Denbye, esq., and Perceval Adde of Silston, clerk, to Thomas Woderoff, esq., Roger Wentworth², Richard Whetlay³, Christopher Bradford, Thomas Wentworth of Gaunton, and Arthur Kay of Wodsom, esq., of all the messuages, lands, tenements, rents and services, meadows, feedings and pastures, with appurtenances in Westbretton, Netherbretton, Elmesall, Claton, and Rotheram, then in the tenure of John Greyn, Richard Walkere, Nicholas Kyrkbye, Robert Hall, Robert Oxle, Edward Mason, John Moere, Richard Hall, William Qwhetlay⁴, Robert Syks⁵, Thomas Trykett, John Norton, Thomas Siks⁶, William Allott, John Campynot, John Oxle, Robert Couden, Richard Masse, and Joan wife of Thomas Jakson, widow, and also a close called Edmondrode in the tenure of Robert Hall and Richard Hall, and a close in Claton in the tenure of Edmund Oxle called Fostall Crofft; to the use of Thomas Wentworth of Westbretton, knt., and Isabel his wife, for their lives, and the heirs male of the body of Matthew Wentworth, father of Sir Thomas, and remainder to Matthew's right heirs male. Also appointment of Ralph Blaker and John Ward as joint attorneys to enter and deliver seisin. Witnesses, Roger Ameas, esq., Henry Everingham⁷ esq., Edmund Oxle, William Dent, Robert Whytfeld, William Wod, Thomas Sigswyk. Westbreton⁸.
