Feb. 21, 1483-4, I Harry Sayvell<sup>7, 8</sup> one of the yomen of the chambre of the king oure soverane lorde, beyng of gude, fressh, and hole mynde, and neverthesse seke in body. My body to be buryd in the church of White Freres in Fletestrete in the suberbes of London, if it fortune me in London decesse. For myn exequies, masse of requiem, and for a trentall of masses there to be songen or saide for my saule, or sone after my decesse, by the said Freres, vj s. viij d. For braking of the grond in the same chirch, and makyng of my grave there before oure Blissed Lady, vj s. viij d. I bequeth x s. to be disposed and distributed by myn exectores to the chirch warkes of Sendale<sup>9</sup> in Yorkeshire, and emonges pore people in the same parissch inhabited, most nedy, that my saule may be prayed fore there. In lyke wise to to<sup>10</sup> the chirch warkes of Thornehill and pore inhabitants there moste nedy, other x s. To the church warkes of Eland and pore, other x s. To Thomas Sayvell, squyer, xl s. To Jane Eland, to hir mariage, xl s. To Elizabeth Eland, to hir mariage, xx s. To every howsald servaunt dwelling w<sup>t</sup> myn olde lady Sayvell xx d. To the reparacion of Eland brige vj s. viij d.; of Cowford-brigge vj s. viij d.; of the new brigge called Mirfeld Brige vj s. viij d. To Robert Agland, to pray for my saule, a cove, or els viij s. in money. I will

that myn exeques, that is to say dirige and masse of requiem, be done for my saule in convenient tyme after my decesse in the parissh chirches of Sendall<sup>11</sup> and Thornehill, and also in the chapell of Eland; and that every preste - have payd for ther laboure iiiiij d. I will that myn executores shall end with John Kynnesley for all such landes as I bought of hym in the most easy wise, then by their discrecions; he to chese whether he will have his landes ageyn, or not: And he will have it ageyn, to paye such money as he hath received, at his ease, as they and he may agree; and they to deale with John Holme in lyke wise. The residue to Elizabeth Waterton, wydowe, and to my broder Thomas Sayvell, to dispose for me by there best discrecion; and to reteigne to their awn proper use after that they have accomplished this my testament. Thomas Blakker,<sup>12</sup> my brother-in-lawe, and my broder Thomas Sayvell squyer, Thomas Broune scryvener of London, writer of thies presentes, William Ermitage, citezeine and upholder of London.
