Whereas before this tyme that ys to say in the Terme of Easter in the Eleaventh yeare of the raigne of our Sou^raigne lord king Charles¹ Henry Scras of Blechington in the County of Sussex gent^r complayn^{ant} exh[']ited his bill of Complaint into this Honorable Court againste Edward Blaker and William Scras defendant^s declaring by the same bill That Whereas Tuppin Scras late of Cumbe in the Parishe of Hamsey in the County of Sussex gent^r deceased being in his life tyme indebted vnto him thye said Complayn^{ant} in the so[']me of Three Hundred Pound by seu^rall bond^s did for the better security of him the complayn^{ant} make a deede of guifte vnto him in December in the eight yeare of his Ma^t raigne of diu^s good^s of his the said Tuppins in the said deede of guift menc[']oned amounting to neere the value of the said debt Which afterward were deposited by the Consent of the said Tuppin and him the Complayn^{ant} into the hand^s of Richard Scras eldest sonne & heire of him the said Tuppen to the end the best value of them should bee made for satisfac[']ion of the Complayn^{ant} the said Richard being bound in some of the bond^s with the said Tuppin and That not long after the said Tuppin dyed intestate before +anie satisfac[']ion of+ the said debt was made and alsoe that not long after the said Richard the Sonne without alt^ring the ppty of the said good^s haveing made a Will dyed and made one Edward Blaker the nowe defendant his Executor And that the said defendant Blaker, by v^rtue of the said Executorshippe poss[']ed himsele of moste of the said good^s excepting some houshold stuffe and Cattle Which hee the Complayn^{ant} did Possesse himsele of by v^rtue of the said deede of Guift vnder Which the said defendant Blaker was as hee the said Complayn^{ant} alleadged well acquainted and which good^s soe by him Poss[']ed did not amount to aboue one Hundered Pound And that after this the other defendant William Scras tooke out l[']res of Administrac[']on of his the said Tuppins estate and

by reason thereof did make title to the said good^s in his the Complayn^{ant}^s Poss[']ion but that afterward finding the iuste Consid[']ac[']on of the Complayn^{ant}^s said deede of Guift and of his debt did afterward conferme the same deed of guift of the said good^s in his the Complayn^{ant}^s Poss[']ion toward the satisfacc[']on of his debt and for soemuch conceived himselfe to bee without any question whatsoeu^r as hee alleadged but further shewed that the said defendant Blaker beweing covetously mynded by v[']tue of his Executorshippe to the said Richard Scras had Poss[']ed himselfe of moste of the good^s sould vnto him the Complayn^{ant} as before ys namely diu[']s Peeces of Plate linnen woollen bedding apparell towells Pewter bras & other thing^s of greate value but that afterward the said defendant Blaker conceiving such his title not good by reason of the said deede of guift had of late before the exh[']iting of the Complayn^{ant}^s byll of Complaint P[']tending the said Tuppin Scras to bee in his debt by bond and that the Complayn^{ant} had wrongfully Poss[']ed himselfe of the said Good^s in his the Complayn^{ant}^s Poss[']ion caused him the Complayn^{ant} to bee arrested by p[']cesse att the Co[']mon lawe as executor in his owne wrong vppon a bond of Twoe hundered Pound^s or thereabout entred into by the said Tuppin as was supposed and threatned to being diu[']s other acc[']ons aginste him the Complayn^{ant} touching the same good^s and had for that p[']pose as the Complayn^{ant} alleadged combyned with the other defendant William Scras to chardge him the Complayn^{ant} therewith and that hee had alsoe by casuall meanes gotten the said deede of guift and confermac[']on of the other defendant William Scras & intended to defeate him the Complayn^{ant} of the rest of his debt the said defendant Seekeing to conceale he said Tuppin Scras and Richard Scras there p[']sonall estate did give out in speeches that the said Tuppin had made a deede of guifte to the said Richard his Sonne the which if any such were was but in truste as the said Complayn^{ant} alleadged and after his the said Complayn^{ant}^s deede and not to p[']iudice him although the said defendant Blaker doth nowe set the same on foote to wrest him the Complayn^{ant} of his iust debt In consid[']ac[']on whereof and to the end the said Blaker and Scras might setfort the truth of all the p[']misses vppon there oathes and that they might discou^r what estate of the said Tuppin and Richard Scras came to the hand^s of the defendant Blaker, or any other to his vse or by or with his privity knowledge or Consent and whether the l[']res of Administrac[']on of the said Tuppins estate were not graunted vnto the said William Scras the other defendant and whether the said deed of guift made to the +said Richard+ Scras if any such were doe not beare date after the said deede made to him the said Complayn^{ant} and but only in truste and might alsoe setforth the date and Condic[']on of the said bond of Twoe Hundered

Pound^s and whether the same were not long since satisfied either by Payment or other security and ought to have beene deliue^d vpp and Cancelled And that hee the said Complayn^{ant} might bee alsoe satisfied the remainder of his said debt and bee discharged of the said suite soe vniustly comenced against him by the defendant Blaker vppon the said Bond therefore Prayed the ayd of this Court & pces of Subpena to bee to them the said Edward Blaker and William Scras directed for there appearance in this Court and aunswering the p^rmisses the which beeing graunted and they therewithall sued they accordingly appeared and made there aunsweres to the same Bill Whereunto the said Complayn^{ant} replued and the defendant^s reioyned and Witnesses were examined on both sides and Published according to the Course of this Court And afterward a day was appointed for the hearing of the said Cause in open Court att which day vppon the hearing & debating of the matt^r in the p^rsence of the Councell learned on both sides the scope of the plaintiff^s bill beeing to establish his Possession in diu^s good^s and to discou^r & to have gayne other good^s apptenyning to him or damag^s for them which the defendant Blaker hath and to bee releived againste the said Blaker vppon a Bond of Twoe Hundered Pound by him Put in suite at the Co^mon lawe againste the plaintiffe as a s^oposed Executor in his owne wrong of Tuppin Scras deceased beeing in his life tyme inebted to the Playntiffe in Three Hundered Pound^s the said Tuppin for the Plaintiff^s satisfacc^on in December Octavo Caroli made a deede to the Plaintiff of diu^s of his the said Tuppins good^s and A greate parte of the said good^s were deliue^d to the Plaintiffe by the said Tuppin & by his direcc^on in his lifetyme but the said Tuppin dying the defendant William Scras tooke administrac^on of Tuppins estate and by v^rtue therepf made title to the Plaintiff^s good soe conveyed as aforesaid but after finding the Plaintiff^s Consid^rac^on to bee iuste the defendant William desisted and made a deede of Confermac^on thereof to the Complayn^{ant} yet the defendant Blaker, beeing executor to Richard Scras eldest sonne of the said Tuppin hee the defendant Blaker layed Clayme to the said good^s and tooke a Way some Part thereof and haveing an aunchient dormant bond of Twoe Hundered Pound^s entered by Richard Scras the Plaintiff^s Father vnto him long since satisfied brought his acc^on att lawe againste the Plaintiff as executor in his owne wrong as aforesaid vppon the said bond of Twoe Hundered Pound^s supposed to bee entered into by the said Tuppin and Wold be the said good^s soe conveyed to the Plaintiff vppon a supposed deede of guift made from the said Tuppin satisfie the debt supposed to bee due vppon the said bond Whereas it nowe appeared by the poff read that Richard Scras eldest Sonnof the said Tuppin did not in his lifetyme euer int^rmedle with any his

said Fathers good^s although the defendant Blaker would nowe set on foote a p^rcedent deede of guift thereof made vnto the said Richard by his said Father, neither could the defendant by any Pofe nowe impeach the Conveyance thereof made to the Plaintiff as aforesaid, And as for the debt p^rtended to bee due vppon the bond of Twoe hundered Pound^s the defendant Blaker haveing put in Two aunsweres in this Court one to a bill exh^rted by the Plaintiff^s Father about eleaven yeares since and the other to the plaintiff^s nowe bill hee by his first aunswere doth Confesse the Whole debt thereby payable to bee dischargd save only a matter of fiftie shilling^s for interest and yet by his second aunswere hee affernes the whole debt to bee due +which answeres doe+ thwart one another, the first aunswere confessing the whole debt to bee payd and the second auerring the debt to bee still due, vppon vppon² all which this Court doth Conceive the said bond fitt to bee dischargd and that the Plaintiffe ought to have and returne the said good^s and to that end yt ys this p^rsent Terme of S^t Michaell that ys to say on Wensday the seaventh day of November in the Fowerteenth yeare of the raigne of our Sou^raigne lord Charles by the grace of God of England Scotland Fraunce and Ireland king defendor of the faith &c['] by the right honorable Thomas lord Coventrye lord keep of the greate Seale of England and the authoritye of the said High Court of Chauncery Ordered and Decreed that the defendant shall deliu^r vpp the said bond to the Plaintiffe to bee cancelled and the plaintiffe shall hould and enjoy the said good according to the deed of Conveyance thereof made vnto him by the said Tuppin as aforesaid
