[On Saturday, December 15, between the hours of 7 and 9, the hymn, "Come Holye Gost Eternall God" etc., being solemnly sung the Cathedral Choir, and the bell being rung for the gathering of the Chapter, James Proctor aforesaid, Masters John Cocell of Stratton, John Bolde of North Alton, John James of Stratford, Robert Modye of the Major Part of the Altar, Jerome Barnabe of Netherhaven, and John Garbrande of Chesingburye and Chute, Canons respectively and Prebendaries of the Cathedral, entered the Chapter-House and formed a Chapter, making William Blacker, public clerk, their chapter scribe, and taking Thomas Curteys and John Sheparde, priests, as witnesses of the election; the Queen's licence being again exhibited and read by William Blacker and the said Thomas Curteys, Subcommunarius of the Cathedral, to whom, by reason of his office, the execution of mandates and citations against the Cathedral dignitaries belonged, having made oath that he had executed the citations by fixing them in their stalls according to the custom of the Cathedral, the absent Dean and dignitaries were ordered to be preconized; which, being done, and Master Edmund Freake, Dean and Prebendary of Haytesbury, Masters George Carewe, Precentor and Prebendary of Netherbury in ecclesia, Thomas White, Chancellor and Prebendary of Bucklesworth, Thomas Lancaster, Treasurer and Prebendary of Calne, Richard Chaundler, Archdeacon of Salisbury and Prebendary of Yetminster with Grymstone, Henry Rylye of Gillingham Major, John Cotterell of Fordyngton with Writhlington, Giles Lawrence, Archdeacon of Wilts, Leonard Bylson of King's Taynton, Robert Ryve of Bitton, Adam Squier of Earl's Winterborne, John Jeffreye of Husbourne with Burbage, Bazar Pernsone of Alton

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Pancras, William Manwood of Wilford and Wodforde, John Baron of South Grauntham, Simon Harbyn of Netherburye in terra, Guido Janetta of Highworth, Stephen Cheston of Beminster prima, John Billing of Horton, Thomas Burbank of Bemynster secunda, William Cole of Dumford, Arthur Sall of Bedminster and Ratclyff, William Overton of Yatesbury, William Bennett of Warminster, Anthony Brasyer of Preston, Henry Harvye of Torleton, Christopher Rookes of Gillingham minor, Ezechiell Taylor of Ruscombe, Richard Bennett of Yetminster secunda, John Fox of Shipton, David Yale of Lyme with Halstock, William Merick of the Lesser Part of the Altar, John Watkins of Busshopeton, and Adrian Hawthorne of Ulscombe, respectively Canons and Prebendaries not appearing, the proceedings were as follows:—]

And I, William Blacker, notary public of the diocese of Salisbury, lawfully appointed scribe of the things done in this behalf, whereas in all and singular the premises so as abovesaid, done and acted in the year of the Lord, the months, days and places recited above, together with the before-named witnesses, lieutenant and canons gathered together in chapter, I was present in person, and I saw, understood and heard all and singular the same so done, and acted as prothonotary to the same; therefore, I have brought together, subscribed and published this present public instrument of the said election, containing the decree therein, in two pieces of parchment, written with another's hand (I having been otherwise lawfully hindered), and I have reduced it into this public and authentic form; I have signed it with my usual and accustomed sign, name and surname and subscription, and with the affixing of the common seal of the said cathedral church of Salisbury in the place of the subscriptions of the same lieutenant and chapter, specially called and requested, in faith and testimony of all and singular the premises.
