*Know present and future that I, William Wotton, have delivered, demised and by this my present charter confirmed to Edward Chitterne, Robert Chandeler, John Leyed, John Fraunces, Thomas Leker, John Hamersmyth, Thomas Gleber, Nicholas Stote, Thomas Blakker, John Jacob, John Brydmer, Robert Newe and Henry Wotton, those two my cottages with gardens and other their appurtenances situate together in New Sarum in Culver Strete, between the cottages late of Richard Barwe on the south and the cottages of Thomas Knoyle on the north; which said cottages with gardens and other their appurtenances I lately had together with William Cokkys, William Halstede, John Cleve brewer, William Prydy and Thomas Saundre of the city of New Sarum now deceased, by the gift and feoffment of Edith who was wife of William Caumbrigge late citizen of London, John Canmel late of New Sarum aforesaid deceased, Thomas Gabayn, William Merwe and Robert Smyth of London, under certain conditions as appears in a certain charter indentate, the date of which is at New Sarum, Wednesday after the feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, in the 19th year of the reign of king Henry the sixth after the Conquest, made thereon more fully appears: to have and to hold the aforesaid two cottages with gardens and other their appurtenances as is above said to the aforesaid Edward, John, John, Thomas, John, Thomas, Nicholas, Thomas, John, John, Robert and Henry, their heirs and assigns, for ever, from the chief lord of the city aforesaid, by the rents and services thence due and of right accustomed, under conditions and the intention of fulfilling and keeping to all those covenants and condition as appear in the aforesaid charter indentate, as I the aforesaid William Wotton, together with the aforesaid William Cokkys, William Halstede, John Glebe, William Prydy and Thomas Saundre were restricted and bound by virtue and reason of the aforesaid charter indentate.*

*In witness of which I have affixed by seal to this present charter; and, as my seal is unknown to many, I have arranged for the seal to be affixed together with that of the office of mayoralty of the city of New Sarum: these being witnesses, William Wotton then mayor of Salisbury, John Whittokesmede then bailiff there, Robert Geve then coroner there, Henry Frende and Hugh Fitzrichard then reeve there, Thomas Freeman, ..... Hore senior, William Wayne, John Syse, Edmund Penston and John Craswell then treasurer (?) and many others. Given at New Sarum aforesaid, the 15th day of the month of September in the 4th year of the reign of king Edward the fourth after the Conquest of England.*

*John Blecher appeared by Ralph Herryett his attorney for a fourth day against Richard Frewen late of Letton in the county aforesaid husbandman, and against Roger Hewes late of Letton in the county aforesaid husbandman, and against John Webbe late of Letton in the county aforesaid bocher, and against John Chambur of Bradbury in the county aforesaid husbandman, in a plea that each of them render him 40s that they owe him and unjustly withhold &c. And (the defendants) have not come; and, as many times, it had been ordered the sheriff to take them if &c. and safe &c. so that he have their bodies here on this day, namely, on the quindene of Easter &c. And the sheriff now reports that they are not found &c. Therefore it is ordered the sheriff to cause them to be exacted from county (court) to county until &c. they shall be outlawed if they do not (appear) &c. and if (they appear) &c, then he shall take them and safe &c. so that he have their bodies here on the morrow of the Lord's Ascension; and wherein &c. On which day the sheriff did not send the writ: therefore, let them be exacted anew, in form aforesaid, to be here on the octaves of Martinmas &c.*
