The first “approver” under the Act of Approvement was Nicholas Elwyn, who was appointed for Devon and Cornwall under patent of 26 January, 1468, and we have an almost complete set of the accounts of these “approvers” during the whole period that the statute was in force, namely, from Michaelmas, 1467, to 22 March, 1478. Thomas Byne succeeded Elwyn at Michaelmas, 1470, but he held office only until Easter, 1471, when he was succeeded until the following Michaelmas by John Ferley, whose account does not appear to have been preserved. John Rowland and Nicholas Henstecote were then appointed under patent of 14 November, 1471; Thomas Elyot under patent of 18 November, 1472, for five years from Michaelmas, 1472, his sureties being Thomas Dokmanton, of Exeter, gent., and John Wykes, of Wyke, gent.; and Richard More for Devon, Cornwall, and several other counties, under patent of 8 November, 1474.
