Upon the opening of the matter in variance this present day to this court by Mr Heartrige (being of the said defendants' counsel), alleging that the said plaintiffs, having exhibited their bill of complaint into this court, and the defendants having answered the said plaintiffs' bill, the said plaintiff, after the said bill had been exhibited, entered certain copyhold lands to which he asserted title by his bill, by force, and expelled the defendants' tenant from the same, contrary to the common order of this court, the defendants' said tenant being in quiet possession at the time the said plaintiffs' bill was

exhibited, and for 25 years and more before, under such title as the defendant claims, by and under such persons as he claims by, from and under. It is therefore ordered that a subpœna be awarded to the said plaintiffs, commanding them by the same to come to this court by the octaves of Trinity next, and to show some good cause to the contrary as to why an injunction should not be granted for maintaining the defendant's possession or his tenant's, as he or they had and held the same at the time the said plaintiff's bill was exhibited and for 25 years before, as is specified above: and in default of such cause being shewn, the said subpœna having been served, an injunction shall be awarded in accordance with the defendants' petition.
