Whereas suite hathe bene in this Court betwene the saide ptis beinge brothers amongst other thing^s for one deede of Feoffment indented wth a schedule therevnto annexed beareinge date the xxvjth daie of September in the thirde and Fowrth yeares of the Raigne of the late Kinge and Queene Phillipp and Marye¹ which deede hathe for many yeares contynued in the possession and keepinge of the saide Raffe Blacker and was made by one Raffe Blacker father to bothe the said pties in which deede and schedule there be dyvers lymitac'ons of his land to severall vses And further whereas the saide Robert Blacker by his bill exhib'ted in this Court claymed the same to belonge vnto him Nowe forasmuch as it appeareth that the saide deede dothe concerne bothe the said pties and their estates in their landes It is ordered at the earnest desire of the saide pties and by their and their Attorneys mutuall consent and agreement that the saide Feoffment and schedule annexed shalbe inrolled in this Courte and that a true Coppie or transcript thereof shalbe made likewise in parchment and testefied vnder the hande of the Clercke of the Inrollment^s which saide transcript shalbe and remayne wth Robert Blacker and the originall as heretofore it hathe shall remayne wth Raffe Blacker and this to be done at the equall charges of both pties

Ralph Blacker defendant

Whereas there has been a suit in the court between the said parties (being brothers) amongst other things concerning a deed of feoffment indented, with a schedule to the same annexed, bearing date the 26 September 3 & 4 Philip & Mary. This deed has for many years remained in the possession and keeping of the said Ralph Blacker: it was made by

one Ralph Blacker (father to both Robert and Ralph). In this deed there are various limitations of his land to separate uses. Moreover, whereas the said Robert Blacker, by his bill exhibited in this court, claimed that the deed belonged to him. Now, as it appears that the said deed concerns both the parties and their estates in their lands, it is ordered (at the earnest request of the said parties, and with the mutual consent and agreement of their attorneys) that the said feoffment and schedule be enrolled in this court, and that a true copy or transcript thereof be made on parchment and testified under the hand of the Clerk of the Enrolments, and that this said transcript shall be and remain with Robert Blacker, the original deed remaining as before with Ralph Blacker; and that this whole process should be done at equal charges to both parties.

Whereby an order of the xijth of Julie last A Subp^a ducens tecum was awarded against the def't to bringe into this Court the bonde and statute in question to be ordered and disposed of as shoulde be meete Forasmuche as vpon the openinge of the matter this present daie by mr Chamberlen beinge of the def'ts Councell and vpon the readinge of an order of the xiiijth of November Anno 2 Jacobi R^{s2} It appeared that after a report made in the cause by S^r George Carew knight one of the mrs of this Court the right Ho: the mr of the Rolles made an order in the cause in the presence of the Councell learned on bothe pt^s By which the pl' shoulde paie vC^l to the def't for his iiij^{cl} debt damages and Cost^s at tymes prefixed by the saide order which the pl' hathe not hethervnto paide And yet hathe procured ~~the~~ +a+ staie of the Def's pceeding^s at the Common lawe of w^{ch} order noe mencion was made at the obteyninge of the last order w^{ch} this Court misliketh It is therefore ordered that the saide Injunction be dissolved

By an order of 12 June last a writ of supœna ducens tecum was issued against the defendant, to make him bring into the court the bond and statute merchant in question, to be dealt with as the court think fit: on the opening of the case in court today by Mr Chamberlen (the defendant's counsel), and on the reading of an order of 13th November 2 James, it appeared that, after a report made concerning this case by sir George Carew knight (one of the Masters of this court), the Right Honourable the Master of the Rolls made an order in this case (in the presence of counsel learned on both sides) by which the plaintiff should pay £500 to the

defendant for his £400 debt, damages and costs; to be paid at dates appointed in the said order. This money the plaintiff has not, to date, paid: but he has obtained an injunction to stay the defendant's proceedings at the Common Law — of which order no mention was made when the last order was obtained. The Court finds such proceedings offensive, and accordingly orders the injunction to be quashed.
