A note as to whether each deponent signed or made their mark is also included. The reference in this database gives the number of the original volume and the opening folio number within it.

This information has been extracted from the Book of Reference for a proposed railway from London to Brighton. The Book and Plans were deposited on 30 November 1830. This information has been extracted from the copy held at the Surrey History centre, Woking where it has the ref QS/6/8/137. There should also be a copy in a Sussex Record Office.

This may or may not be close to the line actually built, which opened in 1841.

Reference needs to be made to the original document as some information has been omitted; generally reference numbers relating to nominations, correspondence and regulations etc., and details about the Establishment size.

Officers were often promoted and moved to a vacancy in another station, but sometimes they filled a vacancy at their present Station. Where there was no change of Station this information was inserted as a note attached to the original entry.

Summerdown Camp, Eastbourne 1915-1918

Summerdown Camp opened in April 1915 and was the first and largest convalescent camp in the country treating soldiers wounded in the First World War. The camp was dismantled in 1920 and the only reminders of the camp are in the street names Summerdown Road and Old Camp Road.

Although there are no official records for Summerdown Camp, Heritage Eastbourne has a comprehensive archive of diaries, photographs, autograph books and journals. We have an almost complete set of the Summerdown Camp Journals published from 1915 (fortnightly) then weekly from 1916 until Feb 1919.
