Grant by Henry, son and heir of William de Blakker, to Sir Adam de Everynham of Rokelay of a yearly rent of 4s with the homages and all the other services in which John de Rokelay was bound to the grantor for a bovate of land in the vill of Wyrkesbrough, in a place called Blacker.
