



In general, I have used "Heraldry" by Stephen Friar as a reference on the subject. Where there was any doubt on interpretation, I've compared with other books.

Potentially significant differences are in **BOLD**.

Gives a pedigree of three generations

Interpretation:


An Argent [silver] chevron [inverted V in the center of a shield] ermines [a form of ermine with white tails on black] between three men's heads in profile [looking sideways] coupéd [cut off] below the shoulders. purple [in purple] crined [hair] or [in gold]

Crest: A horses head coupéd [cut off] sable [in black] maned [showing the mane] and bridled or [in gold]

Conferred [?] by Sir W Segar, Garter [King of Arms], 17 Feb 1616-7 to Edward BLAKER of [location not given, but probably Portslade]

Gives a pedigree of three generations [in the reference]

Harl. 1084f [Reference to a document in the Harleian Society archive, probably now in the British Library].

Interpretation:

BLAKER

An Argent [silver] chevron [inverted V in the center of a shield] ermines [a form of ermine with white tails on black] between three moor's heads in profile [looking sideways] couped [cut off] at the shoulders in sable [black].

Crest: a horses head couped [cut off] sable . mane, **harness** and bridle or [in Gold].
Certified under the hand of W Segar Garter 19 Feb 1616 to Edward BLAKER of Portslade
in Sussex

S[on] of Edward of the same place [Edward was the son of Edward BLAKER senior of
Portslade] and brother of John, Thomas and Henry [3 further sons of Edward BLAKER
Senior].

He [the younger Edward BLAKER] was the father of

1. Edward aged 4 in 1634 [so clearly based on a source after the 1616 grant of arms.
There is and Edward son of Edward baptised in Portslade in an IGI 'extraction' 10 Jan
1629]

2. William [probably the one bapt at Portslade 9 Feb 1631, son of Edward BLAKER]


3. Richard [no sign of him in the IGI in their Porstslade transcript, but is in a user
submission]

4. Susan [no sign of her in the IGI in their Porstslade transcript, but is in a 1629 LDS
member submission]

Transcript:

"BLAKER

or, a chev. peon betw three mens' heads couped at the neck ppr.crimed sa.

Crest. A demi horse salient sa. gorged by a coronet or.

Granted by Sir W Segar Garter in 1613 to William BLAKER of Salisbury in Wilts, Esq, son of William BLAKER descended from BLAKER of Co Derby.

Interpretation:

BLAKER

Or [gold] , a chevron [inverted V in the center of a shield] **peon** [a form of ermine, black with gold tails] between three mens' heads couped [cut off] at the neck purpur [purple] crined [with hair] sable [black].

Crest: A **demi** [upper half] horse **salient** [a beast in the leaping position] sable [black] **gorged** [encircled at the throat] **by a coronet or** [gold]

Granted by Sir W Segar Garter in 1613 to William BLAKER of Salisbury in Wilts, Esq, son of William BLAKER descended from BLAKER of Co Derby.

[so BLAKER of Derby had a descendent William BLAKER, who had a son William BLAKER in Salisbury in 1613].
