Part 5, page 225:

Henry fil Richard de Lister, Adam fil Robert de Torp, William fil Ketel de ead, Adam fil Alan Ketel de Wombwell, **Henry fil Simon de Blaker**, Henry fil Step de Arley, Hugo fil Rad de ead, Henry fil William de Holand, Robert his brother, Adam fil Adam de ead, Lawrence fil Arnold and Henry fil Gait de ead, Jordan fil Robert de Harley, and others.

[The author gives no explanation for this list of names.]

Part 6, page 250:

Mathew fil Henry, Rich. de Wulvelow, Wm. Albus, Peter fil Robert, Thos. Cocus, Jo. Hare, Wm. fil Aldus, **Robt. de la Blakers**, The Abbot of Merivale (dead) a house in Fairfield and one at Mainstanfield, and has there many beasts feeding to the damage of the King and of his beasts, to the value of 8, he paid the King 10m. per annum in the time of the Earl of Derby who gave that land to the Abbot.

[The previous entries given concern the building of houses without permission.]
