 is usually kept and I request that she will keep them as a memorial of my
 said late Mother and myself also I give to the said Anna Matilda Courway
 my gold ring with the initials T. B. over the hair inlaid in it all the
 remainder of my rings jewels trinkets and ornaments of the person I give to
 the said Harriet Pitt and Anna Matilda Courway in equal shares to be divided
 between them by my Executor but in case the said Harriet Pitt should die in
 my lifetime I give the whole to the said Anna Matilda Courway and if she
