Assigns at such day and time as here in manner is Doct here by desire  
 my said two daughters Frances and Elizabeth and their Executors  
 Administrators and Assignes immediately upon the raising and payment of the  
 said two severall fiftie pound out of the aforesaid Estate bequeathed for  
 that and other purposes as aforesaid to ravelle and make void the said  
 pound partly intending by my said bequests of fiftie pound apiece to  
 my said daughters to ease my said debts from the same Obligations Item  
 I give to my said daughter Frances a watch my Diamond ring and my  
 blew enamelled ring and also my great bible with a plush Cover silver  
 chalice and silver Chalice Item I give unto my said daughter Elizabeth  
 a watch my bracelet Andirous grates fire shovell and tongs In the  
 Chamber out part of stances forwarde Item I give my brown Bowle  
 kipt with silver to such of my two daughters Frances and Elizabeth to  
 whom the same shall fall by lott to be cast betwixt them two or  
 otherwise as they shall thinke fitt to determine wch of them shall have  
 it Item I give my bedding Linen plate Jewells ready money Cloathes  
 hangings and all other household stuffe and goods and  
 chattells whatsoever not herein before bequeathed unto my said two  
 daughters Frances and Elizabeth equally to be divided betwixt them  
 share and share like And I doo desire my loving friend Mr Thomas  
 Saarves of the parish of St Dunstons London aforesaid Robert a shir of Bath  
 and my Cousin John Watts to be Overseers of this my last Will and  
 Testament and to be assisting to my said Executors in the execution  
 thereof to whom I give for their pains and care to be taken therein ten  
 shillings apiece to buy each of them a ring And I doo here by these  
 annull and made void all former and other Wills and bequests in force  
 at any time heretofore by me made And doo publish and declare this to  
 be my last Will and Testament and none other In witness whereof  
 I have to this my Will containing three sheets of Paper to each sheet  
 sett my hand and seale the third day of December in the second year of  
 the Reigne of our Sovereign Lord James the second by the grace of God  
 of England Scotland France and Ireland King Defender of the Faith

Yeoman being in good health of body and of sound mind and memory (thanks be given to God for the same) doe make and ordaine this my last Will and Testament in manner and forme following (that is to say) first I commend my soule into the hands of God who gave it and my body to be decently buried at the discretion of my Executors hereinafter named Item I will and give to my four daughters Sarah wife of Thomas Pirknoll Mary wife of John Wralt Elizabeth wife of John Werrall and Susan Wolker twelvet pcent apiece Item all the rest of my goods Chattells and personall Estate whatsoever my Debts legacies and funerals expences being first paid and discharged by my Will and give unto my only sonne Edward Wolker the younger whom I make sole Executor of this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking making null and void all and every other Wills and Testaments by me formerly made In witness whereof I have hereunto sett my hand and seal the day and yeare first above written. The mark of Edward Wolker. Signed sealed and published by the above named Edward Wolker the elder in the presence of William Dawson Thomas and Kingdon Sarah Gardner.

The 27 day of March 1685. I Edward Wolker of Southworp in the County of Kent being of sound and perfect mind memory and understanding (thanks be to God) doe make this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking all former Wills by me made And first I commend my soule to Almighty God my Creator hoping and stedfastly believing in and through the merits of Jesus Christ my only Saviour and Redeemer to have remission of my sins and to inherit eternally with the blessed my body I desire may be committed to the Earth in decent manner And as touching my Estate I shall be owner of at my decease I dispose thereof as followeth first I give and bequeath to my very good friend Dr. Henry Smith Canon of Chr. Ch. in Oxford forty pounds to be paid to him when assaynt and aday after my decease Also I give to the said Dr. Smiths sister Mrs. Mary Turner widow ten pounds to be paid to her within assaynt and aday after my decease Item I give to my Cousin Thomas Under late Auditor for the Dominion of Wales and now living in Magdalen parish in Oxford ten pounds Also I give to his deare wife my Cousin Anne Under ten pounds to be paid to her respectively within assaynt and aday after my decease Item I give to my Niece Elizabeth Fogg the wife of John Fogg fifty pounds, also my six silver spoons to be paid and delivered to her
