particular to an obliteration in the last line of the first side of the said will which
obliteration appearing to the deponent to be and as he knows to be the last of a
the name and words "St. Dunon of the same place Surgeon" with the name &
date "Starr, Betty August 30. 1836" written underneath the said obliteration and which
are in the deceased's own handwriting and referring also to the words "thirty pounds"
appearing to have been struck through with a pen in the first line of the re-
verses side and to the word "one" written on all fours in the same line of the re-
verses side and the initials "St. D." appearing in the deceased's own handwriting in
the margin opposite to said line which that he and his late partner the said Charles
Dunon were at the date of the said will the principal attendants of the said deceased
and so further saith that the said Charles Dunon died in the month 1833 and with
respect to the said charge on the under line of the said reverses side of the said will
he saith that the said deceased after the date of the said will spoke to deponent of her
intention to alter a legacy of £200 which she had thereby given to her brother
William Doury amounting to 100 and some time afterwards told deponent that she had
made such alteration and the said William Charles for himself saith that he
is one of the Executors named in the said will of the said Starr, Betty deceased
and having read what hath been deposed by the said Thomas Jones saith that
he was the solicitor of the said deceased and was employed by her to prepare the
said will and saw the same executed by her and knows that the name & words
appearing struck through with a pen in the last line of the first side and the
first line of the reverses side had of were as by the said Thomas Jones deposed to as
with "St. Dunon of the same place Surgeon thirty pounds" and the deponent further
saith with respect to the following words appearing in the said will to wit "in
together with certain Effects which with a list in my handwriting is contained a
"in a small Cambridge ware box" that a few days after the funeral of the deceased
he made diligent search in all the small boxes & amongst the Effects of the deceased
but could not find any such list that in a Cambridge ware box

double footed put case and two fiddlers counters a small comb and a clasp of

the County of Stafford Gentleman and unto the survivor of them and unto
the Executors or Survivors of such survivor upon trust as to the said William
Richardson to permit my said wife to receive the rents profits dividends & interest

 said daughter Emma the sum of five hundred pounds sterling money and after a
 payment of such sum of five hundred pounds upon trust as to the then residue
 thereof to permit my said wife to receive the rents profits dividends and interests
 thereof for her own use until my daughter Charlotte shall attain the age of a
 twenty one years and then upon trust to pay my said daughter Charlotte the sum
 of five hundred pounds sterling money and as to the then residue of my property
 after payment of such two several sums of five hundred pounds and five hundred
 pounds to permit my said wife to receive the rents profits dividends and interests
 thereof for her own use until my son William Bradford shall attain the age of a
 twenty one years and then upon trust to pay him the sum of five hundred pounds
 sterling money and after such payment to him upon trust as to the then residue of
 my said property to permit my said wife to receive the rents profits dividends and
 interest thereof for and during the term of her natural life and it is my will and
 hereby direct that in case all or any one or more of my said three children or
 Emma Charlotte and William Bradford shall be under the age of twenty one
 years then the said several legacies of five hundred pounds hereby given to them a
 respectively shall not become payable but shall remain as part of my property to the
 interest of which my said wife shall become entitled for life and the principal money
 of which shall be divisible in the same proportion and in the same manner and at
 the same time and to the same persons as is herein after directed with respect to the
 other property which shall be remaining at the death of my said wife to divide
 the then residue of my property equally betwixt and amongst my five children
 Elizabeth Blaker Eliza a Blaker now Eliza Cook and the said Emma Blaker
 Charlotte and William Bradford Blaker or amongst such of them as shall be then living
 and amongst the children of such of them as shall be then dead leaving children
 and at the time of the decease of my said wife such children to take only as
 representatives such share as their decease or part would have taken had he or she
 been living at the time of the decease of my said wife and of hereby authorize my said
 trustees and other the Trustees or Trustee for the time being of this my will to alter
 and vary at their discretion the security or stock upon or in which any of my
 property shall be invested and of hereby authorize them to grant a lease or leases
 of my leasehold property for any term or terms taking fines or not as they please
 or to let the same without lease in the whole or in part or parts and to collect
 in all monies due to me to which such monies and all other monies payable to them
 under this my will in the public funds whether it be a fine or fines received on a
 amount of my leasehold property or otherwise and which monies when invested are to be
 form part of my residuary property to be held upon the trusts before declared of my
 residuary property and of declare that the receipts or receipts of the Trustees for the
 time being of this my will shall be sufficient discharges or a sufficient discharge
 to all persons paying money to them or any of them under the trusts of this my
 will and of declare that the trustees for the time being of this my will shall not
 be answerable the one for the others or other of them but each one only for his or
 own acts deeds and defaults and that they shall not be liable for any loss or a
 amount that may arise from the failure or misconduct of the other or others of
 them or for the failure of any banker broker or other persons or person with
 whom any of the trusts funds under this my will shall be deposited for safe
 custody or otherwise in the execution of the trusts of this my will and that my
 said trustees for the time being shall be at liberty to retire from the performance
 of the trusts of this my will whenever they shall so please but of require and direct
 that there shall be at all times at the least two acting and efficient Trustees
 and of hereby appoint my said wife Mary and William Bradford of Bedford in
 the County of Middlesex Executors and Executrix of this my
 will and hereby revoking all other wills at any time made of declare this to be
 my last will and Testament and I do hereby declare that the said William Bradford
 to this my last will and Testament contained in three sheets of paper set my hand

Appeared Personally Elizabeth Mears of the County of Middlesex widow and made oath that she knew and was well acquainted with Eliza Blaker the Elder formerly of and now in the County of Middlesex Pitura dealer but late of Elizabeth Ferrars Eslington in the County of Middlesex Gentleman deceased for many years before and down to the time of his death the said deponent being the sister of the said deceased and that having in during her life acquainted with the said deceased frequently corresponded with him by letters and received from the deceased many letters which she well knew to have been written and signed by him the said deponent being well acquainted with the manner and character of his handwriting and subscription and the deponent having viewed and inspected the paper writing which is hereto annexed and which purports to be and contain the last will and Testament of the said deceased and which begins thus "This is the last will and Testament of me Eliza Blaker the Elder of Eslington in the County of Middlesex Gentleman" and thus "this tenth day of July one thousand eight hundred and thirty three" and is thus subscribed "Eliza Blaker" and the deponent having particularly noticed and observed the said written signature or subscription to the said will she further made oath that she verily and in her conscience believes the said written signature or subscription to the same to be of the own proper handwriting and subscription of the said deceased = Eliza Mears = on the tenth day of April 1838 the said Elizabeth Mears was duly sworn to the truth of this affidavit = before me = W. Esquire in the County of Middlesex and Robert Barran of in the County of Middlesex Esquire all and singular my Moveables debts Tenements hereditaments and Promises in Calcutta or elsewhere and all my money and securities for money **Personal Estate and Effects** whatsoever and wheresoever to hold unto the said James Pattle George Pollott and Robert Barran and the survivors or survivor of them and the said Executors Executors and assigns of such survivor according to the different natures and qualities of the same Estate but upon the trusts nevertheless herein after to be set forth upon trust that they my said Executors and the survivors or survivor of them and the said Executors Administrators or assigns of such survivor do and shall at his or their discretion after my decease but a subject to the consent of my wife if living to be testified in writing under her hand and seal and dispose of my Moveables debts Tenements hereditaments and real Estate also such part of my personal Estate as shall in its nature be
