 of this my Will and hereby revoking all former or other Wills by me at any time
 heretofore made I be it that this to be my last Will and Testament Du witnesseth
 that I the said Edward Blaker of Long Street have to this my last Will and
 Testament set my hand this 3rd day of October 1856 in the year of our Lord
 One thousand eight hundred and fifty six

of me Thomas Bennell formerly of the Town and County of the Town of a Kingston upon Hull but now of No 37 Russell Street in the Parish of St. Nicholas Old Town in the Parish of Saint Dunstan's otherwise known in the County of Middlesex Gentleman I declare that all my just debts and funeral and testamentary expenses shall be fully paid and satisfied as soon as conveniently may be after my decease I give devise and bequeath to my Nephew John Bennell of Saint Nicols in the County of Huntingdon Esquire all that piece or parcel of ground (being part of a certain close of ground formerly belonging to Bartolomew Potter and containing two acres or thereabouts and situate on the East side of Dove Lane in the Parish of St. Martin in the County of the Town of Kingston upon Hull) containing by abstract amount one hundred and two hundred and ninety three square yards and six feet or thereabouts extending in length from East to West one hundred and eight feet or thereabouts in breadth from North to South at the East end thereof one hundred and seven feet or thereabouts and in breadth from North to South at the West end thereof one hundred and eight feet and six inches or thereabouts bounded by a Plot of ground forming part of the said Close and sold to Edward Abraham or or towards the East by other part of the said Close sold to William Bell or or towards the West by a Road or Street called Edwards Place or or towards the North adjoining lands belonging to the Mayor and Burgesses of Hull or or towards the South together with the five messuages or tenements now standing and being upon the said piece or part of lands there and which said messuages or tenements immediately adjoin each other three whereof are now known and distinguished as Numbers 31, 33, and 35 in Edwards Place in the Town of Kingston upon Hull aforesaid and were standing thereon at the time specified in the said Deed and Assignments and the remaining two of which said messuages or tenements I have since erected upon other part of the said lands to which the said Deed Assignments and premises with the appurtenances thereto into belonging unto him my said Nephew John Bennell his heirs and assigns for ever Also I give and bequeath to him the said John Bennell my silver watch with the chain and appurtenances thereto belonging Also one of my silver Gavel spoons three of my silver Table spoons six of my silver Tea spoons out of my silver Sugar Tongs my silver Cream jug and two of my silver Gilt spoons and also my edition of the Bible and my edition of Shakespeare for his own absolute use and benefit Also I give and bequeath to my Nephew William Stains of Calverton near Nottingham in the County of Nottingham Esquire one of my silver Gavel spoons three of my silver Table spoons six of my silver Tea spoons out of my silver Sugar Tongs two of my silver Gilt spoons my Illustrated Bible consisting of three volumes together with several analogies between the Old and New Testaments and Culpeper's British Herbal for his own absolute use and benefit Also I give and bequeath to Sarah Stains of Whitby in the County of East Yorkshire the daughter of John Stains and Elizabeth Stains the wife the sum of Four hundred pounds of lawful British money
