and Testament of me
Josias Bray of Drogheda in the County of Down late Schoolmaster made this
twenty sixth day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred
and thirty I do hereby declare that I may be buried in a decent and frugal manner and that
I do hereby make my Coffin and that he be paid two pounds over and above his charge
for the same and as to my worldly Estate and Effects I give and dispose thereof as
follows videlicet I give devise and bequeath unto Thomas Barber of Drogheda
aforesaid late Quartermaster in his Majesty's Dock Yard and Henry Brington of the
same Place the sum of two hundred pounds Sterling money to be raised by
sale of part of the sum of six hundred pounds Stock now standing in my name
the three pounds per centum consolidated annuities to be held by them my said Trustees
and the survivor of them the Executors Administrators and assigns upon Trust and
for the benefit of Josias Bray Davis the Grandson of my late wife now residing
with his parents at Portsea in the County of Southampton until he shall attain the
age of twenty one years and upon his attaining that age upon Trust that they
the said Thomas Barber and Henry Brington and the survivor of them and the
Executors Administrators and assigns of such survivor do assign and pay over the
same unto the said Josias Bray Davis together with all interest that shall have
accumulated thereon during his minority but if the said Josias Bray Davis
shall happen to die before attaining his said age of twenty one years without
leaving any Children then I direct that the said sum of two hundred pounds shall
be paid to and divided among all the brothers and sisters of the said Josias Bray
Davis together with the interest that shall have accumulated thereon and I do direct my
said Trustees and Executors to make sale and absolutely dispose of all and
singular my household Goods and furniture Books Linnen and all other articles (not
otherwise disposed of by me which shall belong to me at the time of my decease
I give and bequeath the following Legacies to Samuel Wainwright Son of Mrs
Drogheda Barber the sum of twenty pounds to Arthur Bray of
the sum of ten pounds to James Bray Widow of my late Brother Thomas
Bray the sum of twenty pounds to John Wainwright of Drogheda aforesaid
Inkeeper the sum of thirty pounds to Mr Peter Wakeham Tailor the sum of
five pounds to Mrs William Adams of Stoke Widow the sum of twenty pounds
to Margarett Davy Drogheda the sum of five pounds and to the said
Thomas Barber and Henry Brington the sum of ten pounds each and
legacies to be paid within as short a time as possible after my death and if
any of the said legacies shall die before their respective legacies are paid then
I do direct the same to be paid to their respective families and I give and
bequeath All the rest residue and remainder of my Estate and Effects
monies and Securities for money after payment of all my debts legacies
funeral charges and all expenses attending the execution of this my Will
unto the said Thomas Barber and Henry Brington to be applied as they
shall think proper and I hereby appoint them Executors thereof

Paradise Row Berdual Green the sum of fifty pounds to Amelia Barr my half Sister and Goddaughter I give all my wearing Apparel watch and Trunkers Books Desk &c. &c. and the rest of my property after paying my just debts and funeral expences which I particularly desire may be as plain as possible to be equally divided between John James William Amelia Arthur Jane and Edward Barr the Children of my late father I also appoint Mr. William Darglist & John Barr my half Brother to be my Executors. Proved at London 6th May 1830 before the Worshipful William Colverley an Esq. Doctor of Laws and Surrogate by the Oath of John Barr Esquire Doctor of Law Philip the Brother by the half blood and one of the Executors named in the Will to whom administration was granted having been first sworn duly to administer with power received of making the like Grant to William Darglist the other Executor. p
