 of George Aesty and Thomas Russell the Executors to whom evidence was
 granted having been first sworn duly to administer.

This is the last Will and Testament of Samuel Barker
 of Kingston upon Thames in the County of Surrey Quaker and
 Spring Banns Minister & so hereby direct all my just debts funeral and
 testamentary expenses and the charges of proving this my Will to be
 fully paid and satisfied as soon as conveniently may or after my decease
 and from and after payment and full satisfaction thereof I do hereby give
 and devise unto my dear wife Ann Barker all those two tenements messuages
 or tenements and premises in Kingston upon Thames aforesaid one of which
 is now in my own occupation and the other in the occupation of James
 Taylor as tenant thereof to me to hold the same unto my said dear wife the
 heirs and assigns upon the trusts and to and for the uses intents and pur-
 poses hereinafter mentioned and declared of and concerning the same which
 is to say Upon trust that she my said wife do and shall at such time or
 times as she may think proper sell and absolutely dispose of my said two
 tenements messuages or tenements or either of them either together or in par-
 tials and either by public auction or private contract as she my said wife
 may think most proper for the best price or prices that can at the time of
 such sale or sales be reasonably had or gotten for the same and do
 hereby direct my said wife in case the same messuages or tenements or
 either of them shall be sold in her lifetime to place out and invest the
 sum or sums of money to arise or be produced by such sale or sales in
 some government stock or fund in the name of England in the name of
 her my said wife and for her to receive and take the dividends and profits
 thereof for her own sole use benefit and disposal for and during the term
 of her natural life and I do hereby declare that it shall and may be
 lawful to and for my said wife to receive and take and I do hereby give
 and bequeath to her for and during the term of her natural life or until
 the same tenements and premises shall be sold and disposed of the
 rents and profits of my said two messuages or tenements and premises
 to and for her own absolute use benefit and disposal or to reside in and
 occupy the said house now in my own occupation as she may think
 proper without paying any rent for the same and from and immediately
 after the decease of my said wife I do hereby will and direct that the

heirs and assigns of my said wife do and shall immediately sell and
 dispose of my said two messuages or tenements in Singston aforesaid
 or such one of them as shall not have been disposed of by my said
 wife in her lifetime in pursuance of the power for that purpose therein
 before given to her either by public auction or private contract and either
 together or in such manner of the said houses shall have been pre-
 viously disposed of in parcels as to the said lands or assigns of my
 said wife shall seem most proper and I do hereby declare that the con-
 veyance to arise by such sale or sales as aforesaid whether the same be
 made or sales shall take place in the lifetime of my said wife or after her
 decease shall be held by the said executors or administrators of my
 said wife upon the trusts and to and for the ends intents and purposes
 hereinafter mentioned and ordered of and concerning the same that is
 to say Upon trust to divide the same into four equal parts or shares and
 upon further trust to pay and I do hereby give and bequeath one of
 such four equal parts or shares unto my brother Benjamin Blaker of
 Westchester in the County of York; Taylor and upon further trust to invest
 in their his or her name or name in some government stock or fund
 in the Bank of England one share of such four equal parts or shares
 and to stand possessed thereof and of the dividends and proceeds to arise
 thereon the trust to pay the same dividends and proceeds unto Elizabeth
 Blaker widow of my late brother John Blaker of Selby in the County
 of York; Mariner for and during the term of her natural life or during
 such time as she shall remain unmarried or otherwise to permit and suffer
 her to receive and take the same dividends and proceeds for and during
 such period aforesaid to and for her own absolute use benefit and beho-
 of and I do hereby give and bequeath to such of the children of my said late
 brother John Blaker as shall be living at the time of the decease of
 the survivor of them my said wife and the said Elizabeth Blaker or
 at the time of the decease of my said wife and of the several marriages
 of the said Elizabeth Blaker (as the case may be) in equal parts shares
 and proportions share and share alike whether sons or daughters and
 in case at such time as aforesaid any one or more of the said children
 of my said late brother John Blaker shall be dead having left a child
 or children lawfully begotten and who shall also be living at such time
 as aforesaid then upon further trust for and I do hereby give and
 bequeath to such child or children the share or respective shares to
 which their deceased parent or parents would if living have been entitled
 in equal shares and proportions if more than one and if but one then to
 such one or only child then upon further trust to pay and I do hereby
 give and bequeath one other of such four equal parts or shares unto
 Edmund Swinburn and Hannah Swinburn the two daughters of my late sister
 Mary Swinburn deceased late wife of Thomas Swinburn of Leeds in the
 said County of York; Mariner in equal shares and proportions and if at
 such time as aforesaid the said Edmund Swinburn and Hannah Swinburn
 or either of them shall be dead having left a child or children lawfully
 begotten then or their surviving then upon further trust for and I do
 hereby give and bequeath to such child or children the share or respective
 shares to which they or their parent or respective parents would if a-
 living have been entitled if more than one such child in equal shares
 and proportions and if but one such child then to such one or only child
 and if at such time as aforesaid either of them the said Edmund Swinburn
 and Hannah Swinburn shall be dead without having left such child or
 children as aforesaid I do hereby give and bequeath unto the survivor of
 them the share to which such deceased sister would if living have been

as aforesaid or for any other sum or sums of money

entitled to and for her own absolute use and benefit and upon further trust to pay into the proper hands of my sister Ann Wilson wife of Andrew Wilson of Howden in the said County of York the sum of one hundred and remaining one of such four equal parts or shares as aforesaid and I do hereby declare that the receipt of the said Ann Wilson alone shall notwithstanding her present or any future marriage be the only proper discharge for the said remaining one fourth part of such sum of money to which she may be or become entitled under or by virtue of this my will and in case of the decease of the said Benjamin Blaker and Ann Wilson or of either of them before becoming entitled to such sum or sums of money as is and are given and bequeathed to them then and after by this my will leaving a child or children alive or her surviving then I do hereby give and bequeath unto such child or children of them the said Benjamin Blaker and Ann Wilson respectively the share or respective shares to which the parent or parents or the respective parents or the respective parents of such child or children would if living have been entitled in equal shares and proportions if more than one such child and if but one such child then to such one or only child his or her executor administrators and assigns and whereas I am now possessed of upwards of three hundred pounds in ready money I do hereby give and bequeath unto my said dear wife so much of the ready money now in my possession as shall be over and above and exceed the said sum of three hundred pounds to and for her own absolute use benefit and disposal and as to the said sum of three hundred pounds part of my said ready money I do hereby direct my said wife to invest the same in her name in some good and lawful stock or funds in the Bank of England and I do hereby give and bequeath to my said dear wife the dividends and proceeds of the said sum of three hundred pounds to and for her own proper use benefit and disposal for and during the term of her natural life and as to all and singular my household goods and furniture plate linen &c and all the real residue and remainder of my property estate and effects of what nature or kind soever and whatsoever the same may be which I now or may be seized possessed of or entitled to at the time of my decease I do hereby give devise and bequeath the use and enjoyment of the same unto my said wife for and during the term of her natural life and immediately after the decease of my said wife I do hereby give and bequeath the same unto my son and amongst the said Benjamin Blaker and his children the said Elizabeth Blaker during her widowhood and to the children of my said brother John Blaker after her decease the two daughters of my said sister Mary Swinland and to my said sister Ann Wilson and her children in such and the same way and manner to all intents and purposes as are heretofore mentioned specified and directed with respect to the money to arise by the sale of my said freehold tenements and premises as if the same were here again mentioned specified and directed and I do hereby declare that the receipt and receipts of my said wife or of her heirs executors or administrators shall be a good and sufficient discharge or good and sufficient discharges to the purchaser and purchasers of my said two freehold tenements or premises or either of them and that the person or persons paying the same shall not be bound to see to the application or be accountable for the misapplication of the same and I do hereby nominate constitute and appoint my said wife Ann Blaker and her executors and administrators to be Executor and Executrix of this my will and hereby revoking and making void all former and other wills and bills by me at any times or times heretofore made I do declare this present writing above to be and contain my last will and Testament in witness whereof I the above named Testator Samuel Blaker have to this my last will and Testament contained in four sheets of paper

set my hand and seal that is to say my hand at the bottom of the
 first three sheets and my hand and seal to this fourth and last sheet
 the first day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hun-
 dred and twenty four. - Samuel Blaker Esq - signed sealed published

 Spiers Doctor of Laws and Jurrogate by the oaths of Thomas
 Dawbidge and William Wilson the Executors of the Will of Saml

 Will of the said deceased to whom oaths was granted having been a
 first sworn duly to administer. The said Saml Blaker an Executor as
 named in the said Will died without having proved the same.
