This is the last will and

testament of me John Bennett, a p[re]sente fo[r] a[n] d[omi]n[u]m of London and of this shire residing in the house of the Reverend Ma[n]s[ter] at Sutton in Surrey for the benefit of my said wife. In p[re]senc[e] of me and bequeth unto my much honoured w[ife] Elizabeth Bennet all the personal estate that I am in possession of or am entitled unto with my hands and power to give away to be for her use and disposal in such manner as she may think proper and in witness whereof this eighteenth day of July one thousand seven hundred and forty four John Bennett signed and sealed in the presence of us Ma[n]s[ter] Rowland Elizabeth Stevens. Esq[ui]r.

On the twenty seventh day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and forty four authority with the said Ma[n]s[ter] of the goods chattels and credits of John Bennett late of the parish of Saint Edmund the King London deceased was granted to Elizabeth Bennet widow the natural and lawfull w[ife] of the said deceased and universal legatee named in the said will for that no executor is named therein being first sworn duly and truly to administer the said will. On the eleventh day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and forty four power was granted to the Reverend Ma[n]s[ter] Charles Bellingier Esq[ui]r the natural and lawfull brother and one of the residuary legatees named in the last will and testament of the said John Edward Bellingier late of Burlington in the County of Gloucestershire deceased to administer the goods chattels and credits of the said deceased according to the tenor of the said will for that no executor is named therein being first sworn duly to administer the said will. In witness whereof I commit my soul to almighty God that gave it my body to be devoutly laid in the ground and as touching and concerning what worldly estate God hath been pleased to send me with I give and devise as followeth I give and devise and bequeath to my son Peter Blaker my father his wife and his own and a pair of silver shoes and a pair of silver shoes and a pair of silver shoes to be delivered a day after my decease the whole the residue of my estate both real and personal I give and devise and bequeath to my wife Mary Blaker whom I make sole executrix of this my last will and testament revoking all other wills by me formerly made in witness whereof I have hereunto set and put my hand and seal the twentieth day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and thirty seven Thomas Blaker signed sealed published and declared by the said my wife Mary Blaker to be his last will and testament in the presence of William Edmonds Robert Blaker and John Stovells. &c.

Item if it is agreed and consented unto by the said Thomas and Mary Blaker that after the decease of Mary Blaker all and every worldly endowment she shall be possessed of shall come to Peter Blaker his seeing her devoutly laid in the ground with her husband the day and date as on the other side. Mary Blaker Thomas Blaker In the presence of William Edmonds Robert Blaker and John Stovells. &c.

This Will was proved at London before the Worshipful Robert Chapman Doctor of Laws Surrogate of the Right Honourable John Dodsworth Doctor of Laws and Master or Comptroller of the prerogative Court of the said City of London lawfully constituted the twentieth day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and thirty four by the oath of Mary Blaker widow the wife of the deceased and sole executrix named in the said will to whom admittance was granted of all and singular the goods chattels and credits of the said deceased being first sworn well and truly to administer the same. &c.
