 Barliam his Wife now being in life of all or any other Executor or
 Beneficiary the sum of five pounds to provide her with mourning & I do
 hereby give bequeath unto George Barliam of Stealy upon the
 Estates in the County of Oxford son of my son George Barliam in my
 said Will named the sum of five pounds & I do likewise desire that
 there should be a second Deed act as Executor to my said Will I do
 appoint for this purpose after of my two sons Edward Barliam or
 James Barliam (whichever of them can make it most convenient)
 to act in Court jointly with my son William Barliam my aforesaid
 Executor named in my said Will & I do hereby ratify & confirm my
 said Will in all other particulars thereof & Writings which the said Mary
 Barliam made to this my Codicil set my hand & seal this 22nd day of
 April in the year of our Lord 1814. Mary Barliam (Designated) sealed published
 & declared by the said Mary Barliam the Testatrix as for a Codicil to be
 annexed to her last Will & Testament to be taken as part thereof in the
 presence of us & Writings of John Wells. M^{rs} Rudland /s/

My Son is if my Son Edward Barliam should die before the
 above is due that would come to him that he as his share should be
 divided between his surviving Mother & his wife & his share should be
 aliter & if any of my other sons or Daughters should die for their share to
 go to their Children equally share aliter this is the desire of your

 her name & character of handwriting subscription having often
 seen her write & with her name & having now carefully viewed and
 inspected the paper Writing which annexed purporting to be a Codicil to
 her last Will & Testament of the said deceased beginning thus "Nov^r
 12th 1814 My Son is if my Son Edward Barliam" ending thus "I
 do hereby give bequeath unto George Barliam" & thus subscribed "Mary
 Barliam" they the Deponents say that they truly & in their Conscience
 believe the whole body & contents of the said Codicil beginning ending &
 subscribed as aforesaid & the name "Mary Barliam" which is
 subscribed to be all of the proper handwriting subscription of the said
 Mary Barliam deceased & Richard Stokford & W. Rainforth
 do say they the said Richard Stokford & William Rainforth were duly
 sworn to the Truth of this affidavit before me J. Dawson Esq. Pursant
 J^o Crockett Esq. J^o Dub /s/

Proved at London with 2 Codicils 18th May 1816 before the
 W^{or}shipful John Dawson Esq. of Law & Esq. by the oaths of William Barliam
 the son & Esq. named in the Will & James Barliam the son also the Esq.
 named in the first Codicil to whom admission was granted being first sworn duly
 to Administer for the said Mary Barliam the son & Esq. named in the first Codicil
 in the lifetime of said Testatrix as by acts of Court appear /s/
