All my Goods Chattels Personal Estate and
Effects whatsoever and wheresoever unto my dearly
belov'd Daughter Frances Bromhead Spinster and
make her the said Frances Bromhead Spinster
my sole Executrix of this my Will In witness
whereof I have set my hand and seal this
ninte day of May in the Year of our Lord One
thousand seven hundred and ninty one. Boordm

the Testator as and for his last Will and
Testament in the Presence of us Jno. Bare
J. Field - Lincoln

This Will was proved at London the
seventh day of March the first thousand eight hundred and
five before the Right Honorable Sir William
Comyns Knight Doctor of Laws Master Keeper or
Commissionary of the Prerogative Court of Canterbury
lawfully constituted by the Oath of Frances a
Bromhead the daughter of the deceased and the
sole executrix named in the said Will to a
whom administration was granted of all and
singular the Goods Chattels and Credits of the
said deceased she having been first sworn (by
Commission) duly to administer.

This is the last Will and Testament
of me William Blaker of the Parish of St. Dunstons
in the County of Gloucestre Gentleman First of Will
Order and Decree that all my just Debts funeral
and Testamentary expences be fully paid and
satisfied by my executor and executrix hereinafter
named of Give and Bequeate unto my Dear
wife Mary Blaker one Annuity or yearly rent
charge of fifty pounds of lawful money of the United
Kingdom as current in Great Britain for the term
of her natural life to be paid her my said wife
and her assigns by four equal quarterly xx
Payments (that is to say) on Lady day or
Michaelmas day Whitsunday and on
Christmas day in every Year free and clear
of all taxes and Deductions whatsoever the
first Payment thereof to begin and be made
on such of the said feasts or days of
Payment as shall first and next happen after

their assigns for and during the term of their
natural lives and the life of the longest liver of
them (without impeachment of waste) except in the
Buildings and from and after the determination of that
Estate I Give and Devise the said Messuages Lands
Hereditaments and Premises with their and every of a
their rights members and appurtenances unto the said
Eloar Stoper and Joseph Shorro and their heirs during
the natural lives of my said Daughters Mary Blaker
and Elizabeth Blaker and the life of the longest liver of
them In trust only for preserving the said messuages
and Estates hereafter limited from being defeated or
destroyed and for that purpose to make entries and to
bring Actions as the case shall require Yet nevertheless
to permit and suffer my said Daughter Mary Blaker and
Elizabeth Blaker and their assigns to receive and take the
rents issues and profits thereof to their own use and benefit
for and during the term of their natural lives
and the life of the longest liver of them and from
and after the decease of my said Daughters and the
decease of the survivor of them I Give and Devise
the said Messuages Lands Hereditaments and Premises
unto all and every the children of my said Daughters
Mary Blaker and Elizabeth Blaker lawfully to be born
and to their heirs to take as tenants in common and
not as joint tenants and for want of such issue I
Give and Devise the said Messuages Lands and
Hereditaments with their and every of their rights
members and appurtenances unto James Dowley the
son of Thomas Dowley deceased by Hannah his wife
late Hannah Allingham to hold unto the said James
Dowley his heirs and assigns for ever And as to my
Personal Estate and Effects of what nature or kind soever
and whatsoever (after payment and satisfaction of all my
just debts funeral and testamentary expences and the before
mentioned legacies I Give and bequeath the same and a
every part thereof unto my said son John Blaker his
executors and administrators absolutely and for ever And lastly
I do hereby nominate constitute and appoint my said son
John Blaker and my said Daughters Mary Blaker and
Elizabeth Blaker executor and executrices of this my Will
And do hereby revoke and make void all former and
other Wills by me at any time heretofore made and I
Declare this only to be and contain my last Will and
Testament In witness whereof I the said William Blaker
the Testator have to this my last will and Testament
contained in two sheets of Paper set my hand and seal at
the top of the first sheet where the same are affixed
together my hand at the bottom thereof and my hand and
seal to this last sheet the twentieth ninth day of September
in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred

and Declared by the said William Blaker the Testator as
and for his last Will and Testament in the presence
of us who in the presence of his request and in
the presence of cert. other have hereunto subscribed
our names and witnessed the words "Thus I do
declare the said Annuity to be in lieu and Bar of
Dower" in the right hand line of the first sheet being

This Will was proved at London the second
of March in the Year of our Lord one thousand
eight hundred and five before the Worshipful
Samuel Pearce Parson Doctor of Law Jurrogate
of the Right Honourable the William Wynne Esq^r
also Doctor of Law Master of the Bench or Commissioner
of the Prerogative Court of Canterbury lawfully
constituted by the Letters of John Blaker the son
of the deceased and Mary Blaker and Elizabeth Blaker
spinsters the daughters of the deceased and the
executors named in the said Will to whom
administration was granted of all and singular the
Goods Chattels and Credits of the said deceased
having been first sworn to administer.

This is the last Will and Testament
of me Grace Beddall of East Street in the
Parish of Saint Mary le Bone in the County of
Middlesex Widow first of desire to be buried at
the direction of my Executor hereinafter named
of five and Bequeath unto Mrs. Debora Wood of
Place Garden near Wrexham in the County of
Devon to Mrs. Jane Wood of Goodstone in
the County of Kent to Miss Lydia Woolley of
Northumberland Street in the Parish of Saint
Mary le Bone and County of Middlesex and to
Miss Anne Woolley of the same place and to a
Barry Woolley of Lifford Street in the same Parish
and County Esquire the sum of five Guineas
each for a Ring Also of five and Bequeath unto
John Beddall late of Goodge Street in the Parish of
Saint Pauls and County of Middlesex Greater the
sum of Ten pounds to buy Mourning Cloths of
five and Bequeath to Mary Collett my servant
now living with me the sum of Twenty pounds
all the rest residue and remainder of my Estate
and Effects of what nature or kind soever and
wheresoever that I may be possessed of, interested
in, or intitled unto at the time of my decease
